1. What was the purpose of the project? What did the project plan to achieve and how? (Brief description of the project, max 100 words).

The purpose of the second joint project developed by ASPE and SQEP was to support growth in the demand for and provision of services in public policy and program (PPP) evaluation on the part of Albanian municipalities creating the conditions for extending the experience to other Albanian municipalities. The main components were focused on the diagnosis of the evaluation function in targeted municipalities identifying the needs for training and municipalities support by planning, achieving and using data collection; on the development of a training adapted to the Albanian municipal context by the development, validation and delivery training; on the development of advocacy to strengthen the evaluation in targeted municipalities creating, sharing and discussing on the advocacy document; support of the municipalities in the implementation of the evaluation process by selecting and discussing over one of the PPP; on the identification of the conditions to extend the experience to other Albanian Municipalities doing the evaluation of the project in its various components.

Other discussions are planned with the World Bank, the Swiss Cooperation and UNDP in Tirana on the beginning of July to get support for the next steps of the project.

3. Was the project implemented as planned? If there were changes in the planned activities, why they were necessary?

The expected project end date was March 31, 2014. With the permission of EvalPartners, the project deadline was postponed to June 30, 2014. The timetable has been discussed with the stakeholders and revised to ensure the level of participation of municipalities and the overall accomplishment of the objectives. Three explanatory factors are mentioned:

- Since submitting EVAlbania 2 to EvalPartners, the three municipalities mentioned different pressures in their local
 agenda making impossible the reservation of a common week at the beginning of 2014 for training and other
 planned activities. After discussions with their representatives, June 2014 was identified as the best period.
- Parliamentary elections in Albania were held in June 2013. Due to the change of ruling party (a change in political party of the right to the left), the impact was greatly felt in large Albanian municipalities, including those targeted in the project. This change altered the agenda of municipalities in terms of availability and makes necessary the consideration of new political actors. Hence their interest to postpone the activities planned with ASEP.
- For the ASPE, it becomes an opportunity to develop strategic relationships with new actors in the country and benefit of the favourable environment. Moreover the agreement on June 25th 2014 signed between the Albanian government and the European Community by which the Albania is a candidate country to be part of European Union Community becomes a good incentive of developing evaluation.

The budget was used as intended and the volunteer work of various stakeholders led to the completion of the objectives of the project.

- 4. What are the main lessons learned from the experience of this project that you would like to share with other VOPEs?
 - A great experience of partnership between 2 VOPEs in 2 consecutives projects!
 - Necessary involvement of the political actors in the process and consideration of their agenda and interests;
 - Importance of regular communication with the champions in the municipalities;
 - Importance of the involvement of actors of institutions in the development of the advocacy strategy;
 - Realist expectations for next steps considering the municipalities' capacity to operationalize their engagement in the development of evaluation (organizational and individual capacities, favourable environment).
- 5. Are there plans to continue or expand collaboration started under the project? If so, please describe.

Discussions are underway between ASPE and SQEP on collaboration for the next steps of EVAlbania.
